Mardi Gras Parade Update



Plans for our 2008 Mardi Gras Seawall parade (January 26) are in final stages, and if we had the parade now, it would be quite big. By January, we expect it to be one of our biggest! Stella Bennett and Johnny Lidstone have been working for months lining up marching bands, drill teams, and float entries. Plans are also underway for a big Fat Tuesday parade. Related to parades — **Beads & Throws & Costumes...**

Mardi Gras beads and throws are a popular tradition and an important keepsake to every reveler and Krewe member. Krewe members are always in search of new and different throws, but there are several things to keep in mind when selecting your throws. Make sure they are not too light (will blow backwards or under the floats), not too heavy (could hurt the crowd or break apart), or not too elaborate (small, detailed beads get tangled). If you toss conservatively, you will need a minimum of 10 gross for the Big Parade (Saturday) and Fat Tuesday Parade. Then there are other events during the year that you need beads for such as the Barn Bash, the KOA Mardi Gras party (2nd MG weekend), 4th of July Parade and the Trolley Party—to name a few. Buy enough for the entire year. KOA requires that all beads be a minimum of 33" long. Beads can be ordered online or by telephone from several suppliers in the Baton Rouge/New Orleans area. Online searches for "Mardi Gras beads" will give several company and suppliers in the area, and you can always ask a Krewe member for their favorite supplier. If you decide to travel to the suppliers to purchase the beads since shipping is costly, be sure to check store hours. Krewe tradition is that members ride in costume for the Saturday Seawall Parade. Costumes, in keeping with the Krewe and float theme, may be purchased online or at local party shops or hand made. Also remember, smoking is not permitted on the floats and alcoholic beverages should be put in other containers (no bottles or cans).
